So here I want to welcome and congratulate the *Writers of the Saratoga*, and Rachel Kim, the group's first president.

For the writers of the Saratoga timeliness was very important and once again we needed a quick response from the executive board. The importance and result of the Boards quick action in the matter of membership means a no fee submission for the annual contest for this new chapter. They had paid their dues pending our acceptance so they were ready to go. We want to see some winners from our new members. The executive board was surveyed a third time in the matter of ratification of a slate of contest judges for the monthly contest. Ratification is a matter that might have been dealt with at the October meeting but for an omission on the part of your president, so I iron my hands and think each of you for your cooperation.

Long distance voting is working. I will be using long distance meeting tactics because they work, they are fast, and they are cheap. I have noticed an unanticipated benefit. Some of our members who are eligible for the executive board, but do not attend meetings, have begun to sign in on various issues. These folks are current chapter presidents or past state presidents who have standing on the executive board but for whatever reason do not attend scheduled executive board meetings. I appreciate each of them, the response I receive to my requests, and the voice they provide. I look forward to meeting them face to face.

My request and the point of this long communication themed message is this: I am a gatherer and I want to gather up an e-mail address or e-mail message address from each person eligible to attend executive board meetings. We will always have a community meeting at the annual convention but next year I plan to hold one of the three remaining meetings electronically. Send TWO COPIES of each poem with author's name and address in the upper right corner on ONE copy. Put no identification on the second copy. Address labels are acceptable. Multiple entries are welcome.

Only UNPUBLISHED POEMS and poems not previously awarded a monty prize are eligible. A fee of \$2.00 must accompany each poem submitted (3 for \$5.00). Send cash or make checks to CFCP, Inc. DEADLINE is the last day of the contest month. Envelope must be postmarked no later than 12 midnight of that day. *Print contest month on outside of mailing envelope.*

NOTE: In any month where insufficient entries are received, those poems which were submitted will be held over and judged with the entries for the following month.

1st Prize: \$25.00

2nd Prize: \$15.00

3rd Prize: \$10.00
