## Presidents Message September 2007

In August I asked for and received from the Executive Board a major change in the conduct of the annual contest, at least as regards the Adult portion of the annual contest. NO changes were proposed or made in the manner of conducting the Annual Children's contest. Specifically I asked the Executive Board to approve the following: **All annual contest winners will be announced at the convention at the time of the reading of winning poems.** On August 11 at a reading of the Song of the San Joaquin, one of our members suggested this change. I thought it was a good idea. As a matter of fact this change is consistent with the current procedure for the Roadrunner and the Pegasus, except you will not have to be present to win. If you win and are not there, we will mail your award certificate just as we have in the past. Contest booklets will be distributed after the reading of winning poems at the convention. Winners will be posted on the website after the convention.

Jim Shuman our Monthly Publications Chair was in process of printing our annual contest flyer. The printing made it important to resolve the question of the conduct of the annual contest in a short period of time. The process used was to call a special long distance meeting of the Executive Board. Included on the Executive Board are all of the folks listed on the Updrafts masthead, as well as current chapter presidents and those past CFCP presidents I could identify. The idea had immediately struck me as right yet I felt uneasy as I approached this major change. The problem was I had never discussed it with anyone. The result of the vote was a surprise to me. The overall final response from the Executive Board was 18 in favor and 3 against. The comments I received by email or phone were excited and positive. The major concern cited by executive board members was the need to have reader copies of poems available for convention readers. We can do this and will. This change also means the contest deadline will remain January 31 as it has been in the past. The January 31 date was important to many of you and I am glad we found a way to keep it. My hope is the approved change in the announcement of annual contest winners will make our next convention the most exciting ever. My thanks to Jim for bringing the immediate need for printing instructions to my attention and to all of the members of the executive Board for their swift response and constructive comments.

I had hoped to have the 2009 convention in Sacramento but after some very hard work by Marge Voigt, Carol Frith and a visit to Sacramento by Roberta and I, we have abandoned that proposal. Our October meeting in Modesto will give the Executive Board an opportunity to consider the pros and cons of other locations.

Only UNPUBLISHED POEMS and poems not previously awarded a monty prize are eligible. A fee of \$2.00 must accompany each poem submitted (3 for \$5.00). Send cash or make checks to CFCP, Inc. DEADLINE is the last day of the contest month. Envelope must be postmarked no later than 12 midnight of that day. *Print contest month on outside of mailing envelope.*

NOTE: In any month where insufficient entries are received, those poems which were submitted will be held over and judged with the entries for the following month.
